



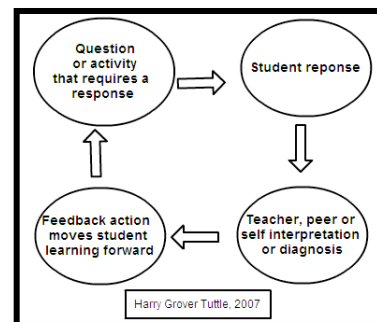
# Measuring How Much a Student Understands...

How do you really know the level of your students' performance?? How do you know if your students are really learning? Formative assessment is more valuable for day-to-day- teaching when it is used to adapt the teaching to meet students' needs. Formative assessment helps teachers to monitor their students' progress and to modify the instruction accordingly. It also helps students to monitor their own progress as they get feedback from their peers and the teacher. Students also find opportunity to revise and refine their thinking by means of formative assessment. Formative assessment is also called educative and classroom assessment.

**Formative Assessments** provide teacher responses that can then be interpreted by the teacher, fellow students or the individual himself. Feedback can be offered so the student can reflect on their work.
