



**The best way to save a YouTube video for your archives is to use RealPlayer.**

1. Go to [www.realplayer.com](http://www.realplayer.com) and download a free version.
2. Once the free version is loaded on your desktop, you need to open it.
3. After opening, the application needs to be placed into your application folder for future use. You may also want to place it in your doc.
4. Every time you view a video, RealPlayer will temporarily save the clips. You can decide to download the video if you want.
5. If you download it, the video will be saved with an .flv extension.
6. Now you can view the video any time you want...off line.



**Inserting a YouTube to a PowerPoint can be trickier.**

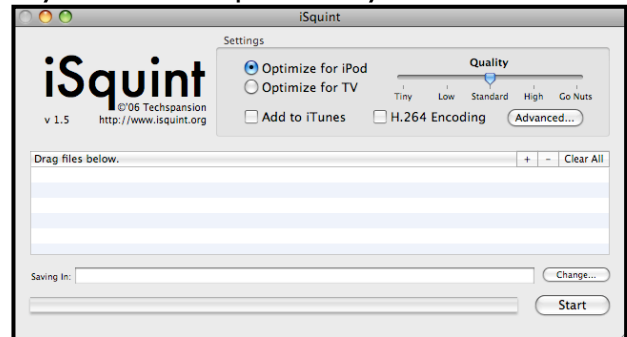
The best way is to convert the .flv to an .mp4, using iSquint.

1. Go to [www.isquint.com](http://www.isquint.com) and download a free version.
2. Once the free version is loaded on your desktop, you need to open it.
3. After opening, the application needs to be placed into your application folder for future use. You may also want to place it in your doc.
4. Open iSquint and drag your .flv files to it.
5. Choose your destination, and convert!!



6. Now that you have a converted mp4, you can insert it to your PowerPoints.
7. While in PowerPoint, go to Insert/Movies.

8. Find your .mp4 movies and present away!



9. You may decide to add your .mp4's to your iTunes library for future use.
