At its voting meeting on August 24, 2010, the Sweet Home Board of Education appointed **Larry J. Leaven** to the position of Assistant

District Agrees to Sell Property to Town of Amherst

The Sweet Home Board of Education has agreed to sell a 44 acre piece of property located at 3015 Sweet Home Road to the Town of Amherst for the purchase price of \$110,000. The property will be part of the Town's Nature View Park. In order for the sale to become official, it will be brought to a public referendum vote on **Tuesday, October 26, 2010**. Please find more information on the vote on page 2 of this newsletter.

"The sale of this piece of property will provide the Town of Amherst with a larger piece of contiguous property for Nature View Park to develop for the residents of the Town of Amherst," said Anthony J. Day, Superintendent of Schools. The park is currently crisscrossed by over 20 miles of informal trails for hiking, jogging, bird watching and nature photography. Located in the northwest corner of the Town of Amherst, Nature View Park is bounded by Tonawanda Creek Road, Campbell Boulevard, North French Road and Sweet Home Road.

Board of Education President Dr. Carol A. Nowak and Town of Amherst Supervisor Barry Weinstein signed the official contract on Wednesday, September 8.

What You Will be Voting On...

Sweet Home Central School District is selling a 44 acre piece of property to the Town of Amherst for use in Nature View Park. The parcel of lands sits at 3015 Sweet Home Road, just north of N. French Road. Its has 272 feet of frontage on Sweet Home Road and extends approximately 420 feet due east. Over 2/3 of the parcel is designated as protected freshwater wetlands, not suitable for building of any kind.

What: Public Referendum on Sale of 3015 Sweet Home Road to Town of Amherst

When: Tuesday, October 26, 2010 • 12 - 8pm

Where: Norman C. Vergils Community Center of Sweet Home High School

Note: All proceeds from this land sale will be placed in a reserve for future tax reduction.

TO VOTE YOU MUST:

- * Provide Proof of Residency
- * Be a resident of the district for at least 30 days
- * Be at least 18 years old
- * Be a U.S. citizen

YOU NEED NOT:

- * Be a registered voter
- * Be a homeowner

PROOF OF RESIDENCY REQUIRED TO VOTE:

All eligible voters will need to provide proof of residency in order to cast their ballots at the Budget Vote on Tuesday, October 26, 2010. According to Chapter 775 of the Laws of New York, voters must present one form of proof which testifies to their legal address.

- * Driver's License
- * Rental/lease receipt
- * Non-Driver Identification Card
- * Utility Bill

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

The Sweet Home Central School District allows for the use of Absentee Ballots at all district votes and elections.

- 1) Request an application by calling 250-1400 or writing the District Clerk's Office, 1901 Sweet Home Road by Tuesday, October 19 if it is to be mailed; on or before October 26 if it is to be picked up.
- 2) Return your application to the district office by Tuesday, October 26, 2010 if the ballot is to be picked up by the voter.
- 3) Complete your ballot and return it by 4:00pm on Tuesday, October 26, 2010 to the District Clerk's Office.

A Message from the Superintendent of Schools...

Collaboration is a central value of our school district. We expect our staff to embrace collaboration in its daily work as the key to building a stronger learning organization and to improve the achievement of our students. In our Central Office, we also seek to model that same spirit in our efforts with the community. We seek opportunities to partner with other entities to make our community better for everyone. Next month, The Sweet Home School District will offer the voters an opportunity to participate in an exciting collaboration project through a referendum to approve the sale of district-owned land to the Town of Amherst.

In the early 1960's, the Sweet Home School District was a relatively young and rapidly growing school district. As part of its future planning at the time, the District acquired parcels of land on which to build new schools as development of the area continued and the student population expanded. Two parcels of approximately sixty-acres were obtained on either side of Sweet Home Road in the northern part of the District. These parcels were designed to serve as potential future sites for new school buildings. As you know, no school was ever constructed on either site. Meanwhile, determinations by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation designated much of the parcel on the east side of Sweet Home Road as "wetlands." This designation both protects and preserves these areas and applies rigorous criterion to guide any possible development.

The Town of Amherst, armed with funding from a NYS grant project, has offered to purchase a portion of this parcel- approximately 44 acres- for the price of \$110, 000. The portion to be sold is located in the rear of the property and carries the wetlands designation rendering it of very limited value for District use. The remaining twenty acres of the original parcel, which lies adjacent to Sweet Home Rd., does not carry the wetlands designation and would remain available as a future District asset. After closing on the proposed sale, the Town would use this parcel to expand and improve Nature View Park in the northwest corner of Amherst. The District would place the proceeds of the sale in a reserve for tax reduction that would serve as a mechanism to help offset financial burdens on our community.

This proposed sale highlights yet another opportunity for collaboration between our school district and the Town. The Town would use this proposed purchase to create a stronger, more valuable Nature View Park as part of a comprehensive plan to increase green space throughout Amherst. This expansion would allow residents to expand upon the over 20 miles of paths and trails used by residents for walking, jogging, bird watching and nature photography. This expansion would provide enhanced educational opportunities for our students as well as those in the Williamsville and Amherst districts. Beyond the park improvements, District residents would also benefit from the receipt of funds that can be used to assist in reducing the tax levy in future budgets. Given today's difficult fiscal climate, any additional source of revenue is welcome help in our efforts to provide relief to the taxpayers.

NYS education law demands that any sale of District property be put to a voter referendum to approve the project. **This referendum will take place on Tuesday, October 26th. The referendum will take place in the Norman Vergils Room at our District Office between the hours of 12:00 Noon and 8:00 PM.** All District residents ages 18 and older are encouraged to cast their vote and to weigh in on this project.

It continues to be a pleasure to work collaboratively with the Town Supervisor Dr. Barry Weinstein as well as the entire Town Board and its staff. I respectfully ask that you please take a few moments on October 26th to vote in the referendum on this project.

Generally, we limit the application of pesticides in our district to the following products:

Insecticide III, Fertilizer & Dicot weed control III 32-4-3, Fungicide VII, Turf Fertilizer and Merit, Talstar, Talstar with Fertilizer, Momentum weed and feed, Primo, Embark, Roundup Pro, Trimec Classic, oryza T+ O and Prosectuor.

These chemicals are in our inventory. Many are used infrequently, nevertheless are listed. Please refer to our specific postings and notifications as to which are used.

School Health Services: Parent Reminder

Student Emergency Contact Information

We ask parents to make every attempt to complete and return to school as soon as possible in early September the *Emergency Contact Information Form*. This form is important in the event that we need to immediately reach you regarding an emergency. Please contact your child's building school nurse for updated information on any health condition that might require monitoring or treatments. Parents should also notify their child's bus driver regarding medical conditions that might require emergency treatment, e.g. diabetes, seizures, heart conditions, etc. A plan between nursing services and transportation personnel will be arranged.

Student Health Screenings and Required Health Reports

Students in Grades Pre-K, Kindergarten, Grades 2, 4, 7, 10, special education and new entrants require a physical examination report and dental health screening report in the beginning of each school year. Parents are asked to please submit your child's HF-1a *Health Certificate/Appraisal Form*, or a signed HF-1f report giving permission for a free school examination by our District Nurse Practitioner or School Physician by the first week in October. Students who do not have a physical examination report on file will be scheduled for a school examination.

Annual School screenings have begun for selected grade level students and include height, weight, vision, hearing, scoliosis, and blood pressure.

Immunizations

No immunizations, no school entry. If your child is in process for a missing immunization and has an appointment for a vaccine, please be sure to keep the appointment. Your child will not be allowed in school after the date of the appointment unless a medical or clinic note is received documenting the vaccination.

Student Illness

Students should remain home from school and parents should consult with their Health Care Provider [HCP] if their child has a fever (elevated temperature of 100 degrees or more). Please do not send your sick child to school medicated. Children with undiagnosed rashes and chronic cough should not be sent to school without being seen by their HCP. A medical note is required for your child to return to school.

Medication

Any medication being administered in school requires a note from the parent and a HCP. The medication must be in the original purchased or prescribed container and should be brought to school by the parent.
